

- em brace place

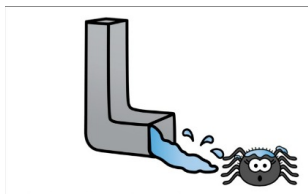

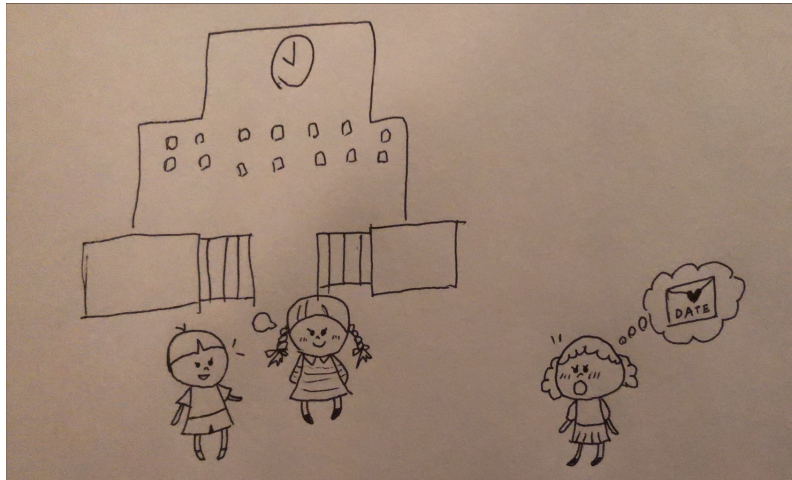
